

Medical Accuracy: National and Oklahoma Definition

The Interagency Coordinating Council for Prevention of Adolescent Pregnancy and Sexually Transmitted Diseases (ICC), State of Oklahoma, adopted the following definition of *medical accuracy in sexuality education and HIV prevention programs* at its meeting on February 5, 2009:

Medical accuracy of information used in sexuality education, teen pregnancy prevention, and HIV/STD prevention programs shall be defined as information relevant to informed decision-making based on the weight of scientific evidence, consistent with generally recognized scientific theory, conducted under accepted scientific methods, published in peer-reviewed journals, and recognized as accurate, objective, and complete by mainstream professional organizations such as the American Medical Association, American College of Obstetrics and Gynecology, American Public Health Association, and American Academy of Pediatrics; government agencies such as the Centers for Disease Control and Prevention, Food and Drug Administration, National Institutes of Health; and scientific advisory groups such as the Institute of Medicine and the Advisory Committee on Immunization Practices. The deliberate withholding of information that is needed to protect life and health (and therefore relevant to informed decision-making) should be considered medically inaccurate.
